
From the Director's Desk...

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#### **Ease of Doing Business - EoDB**

The Indian Economy has finally arrived on the world stage. Global conversations surrounding India have notably increased in the last few years, mostly as a result of over 109 new initiatives taken by the Government, many of which are directed towards the vision of a new well-connected digital India, As per the World Bank 'Ease of Doing Business 2018 Rankings', India has jumped 30 points and has successfully reached the top 100 club. This is proof that the reform agenda constituted by the Government and the subsequent policy initiatives have borne fruit. Now, India aims to be in the top 50. India has the potential to achieve its rightful place as an influential global leader. With lower production costs, easy ways to procure raw materials, a young workforce and progressive yet flexible atmosphere, we're on the right path and ease of doing business that is well within our reach. In the post 2014 elections Central Government has brought new performance index into practice in assessing the performance of each state government. Several parameters were set against which the performance of each State Government will be measured. The very objective of this step is to ensure that every state government will create and compete for getting or doing business competing with other State Governments and during the process exhibit the best performance at business. This competition helps in creating a platform of ease of doing business setting new bench marks. The Index is jointly prepared by World Bank and Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP). All state governments participated in the competition and for the business year 2018 Andhra Pradesh performance is considered as number 1 in ranking and closely followed by Telangana and ranked as number 2 and rest are Haryana, Gujarat and Jharkhand in the order respectively. However, the Northeastern states, except Assam, continue to remain at the bottom of the rankings. The basis considered by the Ministry of Commerce, India is "Reform Evidence Score" and "Feedback" scores. In the words of Ministry of Commerce the objective of this exercise is to improve of delivery of various Central Government regulatory functions and services in an efficient, effective and transparent manner. [harkhand and Telangana scored 100% score in their reform evidence score. The reform evidence score is awarded on the basis of 372 recommendations for reforms on regulatory Processes, Policies, Practices and Procedures spread across 12 reform areas. This exercise created a good and healthy competitive environment among the states of India and ultimate beneficiary is the common man. The team has surveyed on defined, set standard parameters across the Country from more than 5000 private sector users in 23 states and union territories, including 4,300 businesses and 800 architects, lawyers and electrical contractors.

#### Republic Day Celebrations



India became Independent from British rule on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 1947... India did not have a permanent constitution at this time. The drafting committee presented the constitution's first draft to the national assembly on 4<sup>th</sup> November, 1947. The national assembly signed the final English and Hindi language versions of the constitution on 24th January, 1950.India's constitution came into effect on Republic Day, 26th January, 1950. This date was chosen as it was the anniversary of Purna Swaraj Day, which was held on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 1930. The Constitution gave India's citizens the power to govern themselves by choosing their own Government, Dr. Rajendra Prasad took oath as India's first President at the Durbar Hall in the Government House, followed by a residential drive along a route to the Irwin Stadium, where he unfurled India's national flag. Ever since the historic day, 26<sup>th</sup> January is celebrated with festivities and patriotic fervor across India, Republic Day represents the true spirit of the independent India, Military parades, displays of military equipment and the national flag are important symbols on this date. India's national flag is a horizontal tricolor of deep saffron at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of the flag's width to its length is two to three. A navy-blue wheel in the center of the white band represents the chakra. Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the white band's width and it has 24 spokes.

A grand parade is held in New Delhi and the event starts with India's Prime Minister laying a wreath at the Amar Jawan Jyoti at India Gate, to remember soldiers who sacrificed their lives for their country. The President of India takes the military salute during the parade in New Delhi while state governors take the military salutes in state capitals. Every year a foreign head of state will be the president's chief guest on Republic Day. Large military parades are held in New Delhi and the state capitals on Republic Day. Representatives of the Indian Army, Navy and Air Force and traditional dance troupes take part in the parades. Awards and medals of bravery are given to the people from the armed forces and also to civilians. Helicopters from the armed forces then fly past the parade area showering rose petals on the audience. School children also participate in the parade by dancing and singing patriotic songs. Armed Forces personnel also showcase motorcycle rides. The parade concludes with a "fly past" by the Indian Air Force, which involves fighter planes of flying past the dais, symbolically saluting the President. These leave trails of smoke in the colors of the Indian flag.

The 70<sup>th</sup> Republic Day has been celebrated in all its solemnity and grandeur on 26th January 2019. Director Dr. M. Madhavi unfurled the flag and the gathering saluted the National Flag and pledged to uphold the honor, integrity, diversity and uniqueness of India. Addressing the gathering, Director advised everyone to take up the responsibilities and complete the task till the end and quoted that where there is a will there is a way. Prof. G. V. K Reddy, Department of Management has also addressed the gathering and emphasized on the uniqueness and supremacy of Indian Constitution, Students have presented patriotic songs and speeches. Director has awarded Participation Certificates to NSS volunteers appreciating their contribution in various social service activities. Mr. Ch. Satish Kumar, Head, Department of Management, Mr. E. Devender Rao, Head, Department of Computer Applications, Mr. Rama Rao, Assistant Registrar, teaching and non-teaching staff participated in the celebrations. The celebrations came to an end with the distribution of sweets and snacks to everyone.

#### Awareness Program on Thalassemia



There are few immedicable diseases which shatter people entirely but there are few who still find courage and fight with such diseases. Thalassemia is also such a disease which is inherited from parents and on which the patient has no choice but only suffering. Thalassemia is a blood disorder passed down through families (inherited) in which the body makes an abnormal form or inadequate amount of haemoglobin. The disorder results in large numbers of red blood cells being destroyed, which leads to anemia. For addressing the same issue, Ms. Rathnavalli, Co-Founder and Vice President, TSCS, United Andhra visited the institution on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, to educate the students. Thalassemia and Sickle Cell Society (TSCS) is a registered NGO

established in the year 1998 with the pledge to help the Thalassemia patients.

Ms. Rathnavalli has contributed towards helping the patients of Thalassemia. She educated the students on how they can actually put full stop on this deadly disease which is like a life-long curse. There were other members of the society also who were somehow directly and indirectly the victims of the same disease. Their stories left deep down effect on everyone's mind. Ms. Rathnavalli explained that how unawareness regarding the same disease made enormous people see their loved ones suffering throughout their life. This disease not only shaken them emotionally but is also a huge financial burden on them. She also mentioned about the challenges that Thalassemia patients actually face not only in their day to day life but also in their work life and explained about the life toss one has to play if he wants to get rid from this disease. Thalassemia and Sickle Cell Society, requested students to contribute in helping the patients of Thalassemia and take appropriate measures not to fall prey of this disease. After attending this informative session, all the students have made up their mind to support Thalassemia and Sickle Cell Society and help the society towards saving lives of the affected people.

#### Guest Lecture on Digital Marketing

Digital Marketing is the promotion of brands or products using one or more forms of electronic media. Digital Marketing is different from traditional marketing as it involves the usage of channels and methods that helps an organization to study marketing campaigns and comprehend what is effective and what isn't, usually in real time.

Mr. Milan Chivilkar, HR Executive, Right folio Knowledge Services Pvt. Ltd., delivered a lecture on Digital Marketing for students of MBA I Year on 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2019. #### Sankranthi Celebrations

Makara Sankranti is a festival considered to be an auspicious day to forget sourness and bitter relationships with neighbors and to promote harmonious relations. During the festive celebrations, the participants forget the pre-conceived intentions, enjoy with sweet communication, exchange the gifts with everybody irrespective of age and gender. Makara Sankranthi is one of the famous festivals in our Indian system cherishes with great entertainment. Makara Sankranthi is also known as the Harvest Festival, as farmers got new agricultural produce during this season. It is celebrated for three days. Day one is known as 'Bhogi', people sell or throw away old household items and replace with new, marking the course of change. At dawn, they lit a bonfire, wherein all old materials are put under fire, emphasizing the knowledge of Rudra, a form of Lord Shiva. Children are showered with plum fruits to protect them from evil threats. Second day of the festive is the main occasion, Makar Sankranti signifies that the God Sun entered into Makara Rasi, start move from Uttarayanam to Dakshinayanam, perform holy dip in nearby river waters. Family members wear new clothes and enjoy by exchanging homemade delicacies sweets and other foods. Each house is being decorated with rangoli and prays the deity Goddess Saraswati and honour the elders and remember their ancestors. Makara Sankranti traditionally believed to mark the arrival of spring in India. As it is the festival of God Sun, regarded as the symbol of divinity and wisdom. Day three is known as Kanuma, celebrated by feeding cattle and day four is known as Mukkanuma an enjoyable activity acknowledge by spending time with family members and arranging fun activities such as bullock cart or ox races, kite flying, and cock fights.

Makara Sankranti is celebrated in different ways across India according to their traditions, culture and customs. The entire nation irrespective of region welcome the new season of harvest in different styles, with a single notion of joy. It is a harvest festival celebrated in South India. Sankranti is perhaps the only Indian festival being celebrated in all states. Sankranti is celebrated with lots of joy in the campus by Cultural Club-Aroop on 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2019. As a part of the celebrations, Director Dr. M. Madhavi, performed the pooja near bonfire. Students ignited a bonfire with wooden logs. Colourful Rangoli contest was organized in which women faculty members have participated with zeal and enthusiasm by designing rangoli with good messages and different colourful art with Gobbinmalu, Basavanna, Haridasu which highlighted the culture of rural folk, adorned with flowers and idols of goddesses. Speaking on the occasion, Director Dr. M. Madhavi, referred Sankranti as one of the great festivals amongst all Hindu festivals. Director presented the prizes to winners of the Rangoli competition. Kite flying by students was the main attraction in these celebrations. All the faculty members, staff and students took part in these celebrations enthusiastically.

Oral hygiene is the practice of keeping one's mouth clean and free of disease and other problems by regular brushing of the teeth and cleaning between the teeth. It is important that oral hygiene be carried out on a regular basis to enable prevention of dental disease and bad breath.

To provide better health care facilities to the students, the NSS club has organized free eye and dental check up camp on 4th January, 2019 in association with Vasan Eye and Dental Association, Secunderabad. Director, Dr. M. Madhavi had inaugurated the camp. Dr. Prasanth, Ophthalmologist and Dr. Snehitha have conducted various tests and prescribed the needed medication to the faculty, staff and students. Mr. Prasanna Kumar, Marketing Head-Vasan Eye and Dental care coordinated the camp. An orientation was given by the doctors on 'How to protect teeth and eyes'. The camp was initiated with dental awareness talk, educating students about common dental ailments, especially stressing on tooth decay and gum diseases and measures to prevent them. The students were educated about the food choices and food intake which cause tooth decay. The Dentists highlighted about the possible formation of harmful acid which develops when bacteria (plaque) get in contact with sugar in the mouth which ultimately results in tooth decay. The students were given the report summary of the diagnosed problem and the recommended dental treatment plan. The faculty, staff and students have interacted with the Dental Surgeons and clarified their doubts concerning oral diseases. Mr. Ch. Satish Kumar, Head, Department of Management and Mr. E. Devender Rao, Head, Department of Computer Applications, NSS co-ordinators, faculty, staff and students of MBA, MCA and I-MBA have participated in the camp.

#### Birth Anniversary Celebrations of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose



This camp of Humanity was organized by "Thalassemia & Sickle Cell Society Vappala Venkaiah Memorial Blood Bank" in the campus. Director Dr. M. Madhavi had inaugurated the camp. Dr. Ramesh and other medical staff from the Blood Bank rendered their services. Students of MBA, MCA and I-MBA have come forward voluntarily and donated blood for this noble cause.
